Only ten percent of Southerners had to pledge loyalty	Wanted to punish the South and make them pay for their rebellion	Opposed equal rights for African Americans
Wanted to the restore the Union as quickly as possible	Wade-Davis Bill proposed a majority of white male adults had to pledge loyalty	Granted many pardons to Southerners and allowed former Confederates back in government
President from 1861-1865	Congressmen who wanted African Americans to gain equality under the law	Impeached for violating the Tenure of Office Act and firing his Secretary of War

**Freedmen's Bureau**

Purpose was the help African Americans adjust to life after slavery

Provided food, clothing, medicine, and education to former slaves.

**Civil Rights Act of 1866**

Passed in response to black codes, this granted citizenship to African Americans

The first law passed to protect the rights of minorities

**Reconstruction Acts of 1867**

Divided the South into 5 military districts

The South would be governed by army general until they met demands of Congress (ratify 14th amendment)

## Homestead Act

Promised 160 acres of free land to anyone who promised to improve the land

Those eager for land moved west and planted wheat and corn

Half a million american set up farms under this act

## Morrill Act

Government gave land grants for the creation of colleges that taught farming & mechanics

Higher education was more available and affordable for Americans

Colleges emphasized skills needed in an agricultural and industrial society.

## Dawes Act

It was designed to break up the communal structure of natives and encourage assimilation

Divided reservations into individual farms for Native Americans

Five Civilized Tribes lost 90 million acres of land

## Pacific Railway Act

Aided in the construction of a telegraph line and the Transcontinental Railroad

Passed for military purposes: transport of goods across the country

Passed to encourage settlement of the West through the creation of a Railroad

Ended slavery in the U.S.	
Abolition movement successful	
Slaves could move elsewhere

<b>14<sup>th</sup></b> <b>Amendment</b>	
Equal protection under the law for all citizens	
Overturned Dred Scott decision	
Granted citizenship to African Americans	

▼ 4 CARDS	
<b>15<sup>th</sup></b> <b>Amendment</b>	
No racial discrimination in voting	
African American men could participate in elections	
Ulysses S. Grant, a Republican, was reelected in 1872
